<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Walking along main roads 	Pupils and Staff	<p>Year 4 – From the Corn Exchange, Lower Pantiles to the top cricket pitch of the Neville sports ground.</p> <p>Each bubble within the year group will be separated by staff guides but may walk as a whole to the site.</p> <p>The bubbles will leave the corn exchange via the front door and make their way to the pelican crossing at Nevill Street.</p> <p>The bubbles will use the pelican crossing to cross through to Warwick Park.</p> <p>Remaining on the left side of the road, they will make their way up to the Neville Grounds.</p> <p>There will be two side roads to cross. Each bubble will cross separately with their teacher in a line of twos directly to the other side.</p>							
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Collison with vehicles 	Pupils, and staff	Teaching staff will follow the green cross code at all times

		<p>Crossing will not take place at points with poor visibility</p> <p>Pelican or zebra crossings must be used where available</p> <p>At least 2 members of staff in the year group must wear hi viz jackets</p> <p>Each bubble will ensure that children follow the instructions of school staff.</p> <p>Teaching staff will ensure that there is a substantial gap in traffic to allow the whole bubble to cross in one go.</p> <p>Teaching staff will be cautious of cyclists and other pedestrians.</p>							
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Trips and falls 	Pupils and staff	<p>Each bubble's teacher will take plasters, wipes, gloves and face mask with them on each walk.</p> <p>All teaching staff are first aid trained.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At the Neville 	Pupils and staff	<p>There is a public right of way across the Neville ground and so pupils will be closely supervised at all times and staff will monitor any visitor activity.</p> <p>Pupils will be kept in bubbles for all activities.</p> <p>PE staff will keep their distance at all times and will wear ppe if they have to make contact with a child for medical care</p> <p>Gazebos will be used to shelter from the rain and the shade of the treeline can also be used to shelter from the sun.</p> <p>Children need their water bottles and sun hats at all times or else they may be asked to sit out from the activity</p> <p>PE staff will allow rest time for at least half the session on hot days</p>

Risk Rating Matrix

Likelihood	Description	Score
Very unlikely	Unforeseeable that an injury or incident could happen. A 1 in a million chance of a hazardous event happening.	1
Unlikely	An injury or incident could happen, although unlikely. A 1 in 100,000 chance of the hazardous event happening.	2
Fairly likely	An injury or incident may happen. A 1 in 10,000 chance of the hazardous event happening.	3
Likely	It is foreseeable that an injury or incident will happen. A 1 in 1000 chance of the hazardous event happening.	4
Very Likely	Imminent possibility of injury or accident. A 1 in 100 chance of the hazardous event happening.	5

Severity / Consequence	Description	Score
Insignificant	No injury	1
Minor	Injuries only requiring on site first aid	2
Moderate	Injuries that might require further medical attention and injuries that could lead up 3 days' absence	3
Major	Serious injury including broken limbs and injuries leading to over 7 days' absence	4
Catastrophic	Fatality	5

Risk rating	Actions	
1-2	No action	No further action but ensure controls are maintained.
3-6	Monitor	Look to improve at next review or if there is a significant change.
8-12	Action	Review existing controls and make any improvements identified within a specified timetable.
15-16	Urgent action	Take immediate action and stop activity if necessary, maintain controls rigorously.
20-25	Stop	Stop activity and take immediate action.
